DSRPC Fall 2019 Club Swap Meet - FAQ

Q: Is the Club Swap open to the public? A: The DSRPC Club Swap is NOT open to the public. As always, Club members may bring guests (up to 4). Guests must be accompanied by their host member at all times. Non-family guests will be charged the usual guest fee (\$5) at the gate, since ranges will be in use.

Q: How do I sign up for a table for the Swap? A: Stop by the Range Safety Officer shack at the range. Bring ten bucks per table (maximum of one per member) and pick out your spot on the Swap layout sheet. We will make every effort to assign your picked location but the layout may change based on the total number of tables. You must be a Club member to reserve a table.

Q. Will there be food to buy at the swap? A: Once again, the World Renowned Ricochet Cafe will be serving hot java, donuts, chips, hot dogs, burgers, cold water and soda at popular prices. All proceeds from food sales will go to the Club's Youth Shooting programs. There will be seating for Cafe customers so you can enjoy sharing a cup of Joe and swapping lies with your fellow club members.

Q. Can I use a check, credit/debit card or Bitcoin to pay for tables, food, guests, and member items for sale?

A: No, nope, no sir, no ma'am, no way, no how.

Q. Can I buy and/or sell my personal firearms at the swap? A: Yes, you can. Private gun sales in Nevada *will require a*

Background check beginning on January 2, 2020. On February 15, 2019, Governor Sisolak signed SB147 into law, which will require background checks for most private gun sales. For more information on this see

Q. Can I legally sell firearms stuff to out-of-state residents? A: Possibly, depending on Nevada and the state in question's laws, but we're not lawyers and we don't play one on TV. If you're unsure about the legality of selling ammunition, magazines or firearms to someone, err on the side of caution...don't do it.

Q: Are "Blue Cards" (registering handguns with Metro) still required in Nevada? A: No they are not.

However, we do recommend using a Bill of Sale to document transfers of ownership. Blank Bills of Sale will be provided at the swap for Buyer and Seller Use. Some sellers ask for Nevada ID and/or a CCW. That's not a bad idea.

Q: Can I Open Carry at the Club Swap? A: NO, Open Carry is NOT allowed at the swap. While DSRPC is a strong supporter of the right to carry openly, we do recognize that a large number of unsecured firearms may present a safety hazard in crowded, tightly confined areas. Therefore, Open Carry is not allowed in the Swap Meet building. All firearms on display at the Swap Meet must be unloaded and either a) be secured with a nylon zip tie that prevents accidental discharge of the firearm or b) if a rifle, have the bolt removed.

Open Carry is still fine anywhere else on the DSRPC range.

Q: Can I sell non-shooting related items at the swap? A: Yes, you can sell the Rudy Guiliani wind-up chattering dentures that Aunt Edna gave you last year. Just use common sense...that bottle of Nancy Peolosi Botox and Face Lift cream collecting dust in the bathroom soap cozy is not likely to be a hot item.
